TERMS OF COMPETITION

KZNGU has the right to change or update the set tournament conditions should there be a change in government regulations regarding Covid-19 protocols.

Covid-19 Risk Mitigation Protocols: Participation subject to agreement and implementation of SA Government Regulations / Directions, GolfRSA Good Golf Practice Guidelines, and the host facility's Risk Mitigation Plan (RMP) and a Tournament Risk Mitigation Procedure (TRMP). The Union and / or host Club have the right to refuse participation.

1. Eligibility:

The tournament is open to any amateur golfer, who is affiliated to Women's Golf South Africa (WGSA), GolfRSA or a governing body recognised by WGSA or GolfRSA.

2. Handicap Limits & Format:

- 2.1 Format is 4 Ball Alliance with 2 scores to count using Stableford points.
- 2.2 Playing Handicap of 85% Playing Allowance will apply.

3. Rules of Golf:

The Rules of Golf as adopted by the R & A Rules Limited will apply together with such local rules as approved by the Tournament Committee.

4. Tournament Committee:

The Tournament Committee will be appointed by the KZNLGA Executive Committee and their names will be displayed on the Tournament Notice Board at the Host Club. This committee reserves the right to alter the programme, regulations, and conditions of the event at any time, including starting times. All disputes shall be settled by the Tournament Committee whose decision shall be final. Any dispute/protest should be lodged within 15 minutes of completion of the round. This information may be requested in writing.

5. Entries:

All entries shall be subject to the approval of the KZNLGA Executive Committee. No entries will be accepted from players whose handicaps have lapsed. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to limit the field. In the event of the tournament being oversubscribed, the Tournament Committee reserves the right to reduce numbers with preference being given to KZNLGA + KZN affiliated players and then eliminating in handicap order, from the highest handicap.
International Players are requested to contact Vanessa Colby (sec@kznlga.co.za) to request consideration of their entry by the Executive.

6. Handicaps:

Handicap Index as of 06h00 on the 28th of February 2021 shall apply. The appropriate Victoria Country Club Course Conversion Tables for Male – White or Blue Tees or for Female Blue or Red Tees, will be applied to determine the players Course Handicap. Players are requested to have all open rounds captured by the above-mentioned time and date. It is the responsibility of each competitor to advise the Tournament Administrator (Vanessa Colby: sec@kznlga.co.za / 082 870 3621) of their correct handicap on the 28th of February 2021, subject to the following conditions:

- 6.1 Those players who are affiliated to WGSA and GolfRSA who have not been in South Africa for the last 6 months or part thereof, are required to have submitted their scores on the HNA as a "foreign round" and provide a verification of these foreign

rounds, unless sufficient current rounds have been played in South Africa to validate their South African handicap.

6.2 Those players who are not affiliated to WGSA + GolfRSA (i.e., non-SA players) are required to submit a Handicap certification from their Federation or Home Club in writing at registration.

7. Ties:

In the event of a tie for the 1st place, then the trophy will be shared. All other ties will be decided in accordance with the KZNLGA Count-out method.

The trophy will be awarded to the Mixed 4 Ball with 2 x Men and 2 x Ladies, with the highest 18-hole Stableford points using 2 x scores to count.

8. Caddies:

Competitors may not engage as a caddie anyone who is, or has been at any time, a member of a professional golf association. Persons who have regained their amateur status are not included in this prohibition. **Caddies may be reserved by contacting Victoria Country Club (Tel: 033 347 1394).** The Host Club's Caddie Policy must be adhered to.

Outside Caddies are NOT permitted.

Guest Caddies: (family/friends) are permitted, on payment of a R100 refundable deposit for a caddie bib that must be worn by the caddie, throughout the play of the 18 hole event.

Penalty for Breach of Condition: General Penalty (two strokes) for each hole at which any breach occurred; maximum penalty per round – Four strokes. In the event of a breach between the play of two holes, the penalty applies to the next hole. A player having a caddie in breach of this condition must immediately upon discovery that a breach has occurred ensure that she conforms to this condition for the remainder of the stipulated round. Otherwise, the player is disqualified.

9. Transport:

Motorized golf carts are allowed. **It is the responsibility of competitors to book motorized golf carts directly with Victoria Country Club (033 347 1394).** The availability of ride-on carts is not the responsibility of KZNLGA Golf.

10. Pace of Play:

The KZNLGA Pace of Play Policy is in force and will be displayed on the Tournament Notice Board.

11. Score Information:

If requested to do so, players must provide score information to the Tournament Officials, throughout the course of play.

12. Scoring & Results:

A competitor is considered to have returned their score card when they have left the designated scoring area. The results are deemed to be officially announced and the competition closed at the commencement of the physical or virtual prize-giving ceremony.

Prize Giving Ceremony: Dependant on Government, Club and GolfRSA regulations / recommendations.

13. Dress Code:

In accordance with Host Club in the Club House, KZNLGA on the golf course and practice area.

14. Drug Free Sport:

Anti-Doping constitutes a range of activities aimed at eliminating doping in sport, as well as protecting clean athletes and the integrity and values of sport. There are 11 Anti-Doping Rule Violations of which Use, or Attempted Use by an Athlete of a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method is one. All Competitors are subject to the provisions of the South African Institute for Drug-Free Sport's Anti-Doping (SAIDS) Rules. Details of the SAIDS Anti-Doping Rules, and the current List of Prohibited Substances and Methods, are available from the SAIDS website (www.drugfreesport.org.za). Competitors can do a medication check on the SAIDS website at the following link <https://drugfreesport.org.za/online-medication-check/> and should bear in mind that this list does not include Supplements. Information on Supplements is available at the following link <https://drugfreesport.org.za/supplements-and-their-risks/>.

Competitors who have illnesses or conditions that require them to take particular medications or undergo procedures may have to apply for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE). If the medication or method a competitor requires to treat an illness or condition falls under the Prohibited List, a TUE may give that athlete the authorisation to use the required medicine or method. Only certain categories of Competitors need to apply for a TUE in advance. Competitors should check the SAIDS website at the following link <https://drugfreesport.org.za/who-needs-to-apply-for-a-tue/> which level of Competitors need to apply for a TUE in advance from SAIDS. Competitors who are taking medication and are in doubt as to their clinical status, should seek advice from WGSA no later than 30 days before the start of the Championships.

Drug-Testing may be authorised at any event under the jurisdiction of GolfRSA/WGSA.

15. Publicity:

KZNLGA and the sponsors of the Championship may arrange publicity before, during and after the Tournament in the press, by live and recorded radio, television and by filming. The competitors assent to references to them and pictures of them at practice and in play appearing and being used for commercial purposes by KZNLGA and their Sponsors.

16. Etiquette:

The audible emission or unauthorized use of a mobile telephone or electronic equipment on the golf course or during play is a serious breach of etiquette and will attract a warning and possible disqualification (Rule 1.2). Cell phones should be switched off on the course and may only be used in an emergency.

17. Weather Delays and Suspension of Play:

The following signals are in force:

- Discontinue Play Immediately: One prolonged note of siren.
- Discontinue Play: Three consecutive notes of siren, repeated.
- Resume Play: Two short notes of siren, repeated

In addition, the Note under Rule 5.7b in the Rule of Golf is applicable. When play is suspended by the Tournament Committee for a dangerous situation, if the players in a match or group are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the Tournament Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they are in the process of playing a hole, they must discontinue play immediately and not resume play until the Tournament Committee has ordered a resumption of play. If a player fails to discontinue play immediately, she is disqualified, unless circumstances warrant waiving the penalty as provided in the Rules of Golf Committee Procedures Section 6c. The signal for suspending play due to a dangerous situation will be a prolonged note of the siren.

18. Spectators:

Dependant on Government, Club and GolfRSA regulations / recommendations.

If permitted, Spectators to keep off tees, fairways and greens - at all times and not interfere with any player. The audible emission of cell phones is not acceptable and cell phones should be switched off. The use of motorised golf cars by spectators is not permitted without the consent of the KZNLGA President. Failure to adhere to such requests could lead to the spectators being asked to leave the golf course.

19. Liability:

The Union does not warrant or guarantee the safety of any person. The Union and its management will not be held liable or responsible for any damages, loss, including personal loss and or other forms of loss, harm or injury sustained as stipulated below:

- Physical and/or emotional injuries suffered by any person, including a player or spectator, during the tournament, due to any acts of God, suffered as a direct result thereof, including aspects such as being struck by lightning, etc.
- Physical injuries of any kind suffered by any person, including a player or spectator, sustained by own negligence, or otherwise.
- Emotional injuries sustained due to any loss, including death, suffered as a result of any of the above injuries sustained personally or by a spectator.
- Damages suffered to any property of a player or spectator.
