#### **CONDITIONS OF TOURNAMENT FOR MIDLANDS REGION CHAMPIONSHIPS**

- 1. <u>Entries</u>: The tournament is open to any amateur golfer affiliated to Women's Golf South Africa or a governing body recognized by the WGSA. Handicap limits are set out on the official entry form.
- 2. The Rules of Golf as approved by the R & A Rules Limited will apply together with such local rules as approved by the Tournament Committee. The KZNLGA Hard Card will be in effect. Additional tournament conditions will be displayed at the Host Club.
- 3. The Tournament Committee shall consist of members of the Executive Committee of the MLGA and an official appointed by the KZNLGA Rules & Referees Panel. The Executive Committee reserves the right to alter the program and conditions of the event/s at any time, including starting times. All disputes shall be settled by the Tournament Committee whose decision shall be final. Any dispute/protest must be lodged within 15 minutes of completion of the round. This information may be requested in writing.
- 4. <u>Handicaps:</u> Players Handicap Index as of 06h00 on the day of the Championship will determine the division in which a player competes. If a change in division has occurred since the close of entries, the player will play where drawn in the published time sheet for the round but compete in the correct division. Nett Event: Only players with an official WGSA handicap are eligible for the nett events.
- 5. Draw: The tournament draw is seeded.
- 6. <u>Time of Starting</u>: Competitors shall start at the time laid down by the Committee (Rule 5.3a).
- 7. Competitors must report to the "Starters" 10 (TEN) MINUTES before their advertised time of play. The Tournament Committee shall have the power to delay the time of starting if they consider that circumstances render this necessary.
- 8. <u>Caddies</u>: No outside caddies are allowed. Guest caddies are allowed, however, competitors may not engage as a caddie, a professional, or assistant professional who is a member of the Professional Golf Association. <u>Penalty for breach disqualification</u>.
- 9. <u>Dress Code</u>: Smart casual in the Clubhouse, appropriate golf wear on the course.
- 10. <u>Scoring and Results</u>: A competitor is considered to have returned her score card when she has left the designated scoring area.
- 11. Anti-Doping: A competitor shall not knowingly make use of any drug to enhance her performance.

  Attention of competitors is drawn to the prescribed list of drugs issued by the South African Institute for Drug Free Sport. Consult the web-site <a href="https://www.drugfreesport.org.za">www.drugfreesport.org.za</a> or telephone their hot-line 021

  4483888 during office hours. Any competitor infringing the condition, or refusing to take a test if asked to do so, may be disqualified.
- 12. <u>Spectators</u>: Spectators are to keep off the tees, fairways and greens at all times and not interfere with any player. The use of golf carts by spectators is not permitted. The audible emission of cell phones is not acceptable and cell phones should be switched off.
- 13. <u>Etiquette</u>: Un-authorized use or audible emission of a mobile telephone on the golf course or during play is a serious breach of etiquette and will attract a warning. Offenders could also be subject to penalties.
- 14. <u>Trophy:</u> In the event of a tie, the tied players will be declared joint winners and share the Trophy and a count out will be done for the prize.
- 15. <u>Liability Clause</u>: The host club, Tournament Committee and any of their management will not be held responsible for any direct or indirect: damages, loss, including personal loss and or other forms of less, harm or injury sustained by any person due to any cause whatsoever.
- 16. <u>Cancellation of a Round</u>: In the event of play being delayed or declared null and void for any round of the tournament, additional play will be at the discretion of the Tournament Committee. Should the Tournament Committee be of the opinion not to continue play due to adverse weather or any other occurrence beyond its control, then, in stroke play tournaments, the result will be declared over the number of rounds completed by all players. Play will not be continued beyond the advertised final day of the event.
- 17. Competitors agree to abide by the Tournament Conditions and Code of Conduct.
